COMPARING EPA PROGRAMS FOR SCHOOL BUSES

The <u>EPA Clean Heavy-Duty Vehicle Program</u> (CHDVP) launched in April 2024, with applications due July 25. The program is different from the pre-existing <u>EPA Clean School Bus Program</u> (CSBP), which is expected to open a rebate funding round later in 2024. Key differences are outlined below, using past EPA Clean School Bus Program structures as guidance. For additional details, please visit each program's respective website.
